# Current Election Equipment

- Purchased in 2001-2002 with Help America Vote Act (HAVA) Funding
- Lifespan 12-15 years
- Over 200 machines inoperable and losing between 20-25 machines per election

Machines are counting correctly. The issue is the hardware. (ie. mother board, screen, legs, etc.) Vendors no longer produce and/or sell parts for these machines.

- County rented machines for November 2018 but those machines are also approximately 15 years old.



# New Equipment

- In July of 2016, El Paso County received demonstrations from vendors on new election equipment. There was overwhelming support from those who attended in purchasing the ballot marking devices (BMD) rather than the traditional direct recording electronic (DRE) devices.
- The BMD system allows a voter to vote at any location but also produces a paper ballot for the voter to review before casting. The paper ballots are securely stored and retained for the legally required 22 months.
- Bipartisan Federal Legislation banning the use of DRE machines by 2020 expected to pass in 2019.



# Ballot Marking Device Vendors

- There are currently two vendors whose new voting systems are certified in the State of Texas-**Hart InterCivic (Hart)** and **Election Systems and Software (ES&S)**.
- In the prior RFP (2016), which did not move to negotiation or award due to anticipated changes in the election code, the offered pricing by Hart InterCivic was much higher than what we are being offered now. However, without negotiation and award having occurred, we do not know how final contract pricing would have turned out.

- Election Management Software-Approx \$49500.00
- Beginning with year 2, maintenance of equipment will be paid from  
Special Revenue Account.

# ExpressVote®

Universal Voting System as a Marker

**Touch Screen and Display**  
Allows voters to easily make vote selections and review their selection.

**Multilingual**

**Instruction Panel**  
A visual guide that shows voters how to use the ExpressVote.

**Card Slot**  
Where the voter inserts their card to activate selections.

**Front Access Panel**  
Headphone jack, a port for sip and puff or two-position rocker switch, and Audio-Tactile Keypad make the unit ADA friendly.

**Audio-Tactile Keypad**  
Enables ADA voters to control audio and navigation.

**Visual Aids**  
High contrast and zoom functionality.

**ACTIVATING THE VOTE SESSION:**  
Election officials can configure the ExpressVote to best fit their needs. The voter receives an activation card to begin the process.

- If only one ballot style is programmed for the election, a blank card activates the vote session.
- Multiple ballot styles with a blank card prompt poll workers to select the correct ballot style for the voter.
- A card with an activation barcode automatically displays the correct options for the voter if the election has multiple ballot styles.

### Dual-Use Cover

Protective cover doubles as carrying case lid with heavy-duty rubber seal to shelter DS200 from elements during transport.

### Easy to Set Up

Lid-up, power-on approach allows poll workers to easily open polls in one simple step.

### Touch Screen and Display

Voters with instructions and immediate feedback. Tension bearings hold screen in place for custom positioning.

### Ballot Slot/Card Slot

Where voter inserts ballot and ExpressVote activation card; accepts sizes up to 19".

### Auxiliary Ballot Compartment

Easy, hassle-free storage of up to 2,500 ballots that are 8.5-inches wide and up to 19-inches in length.

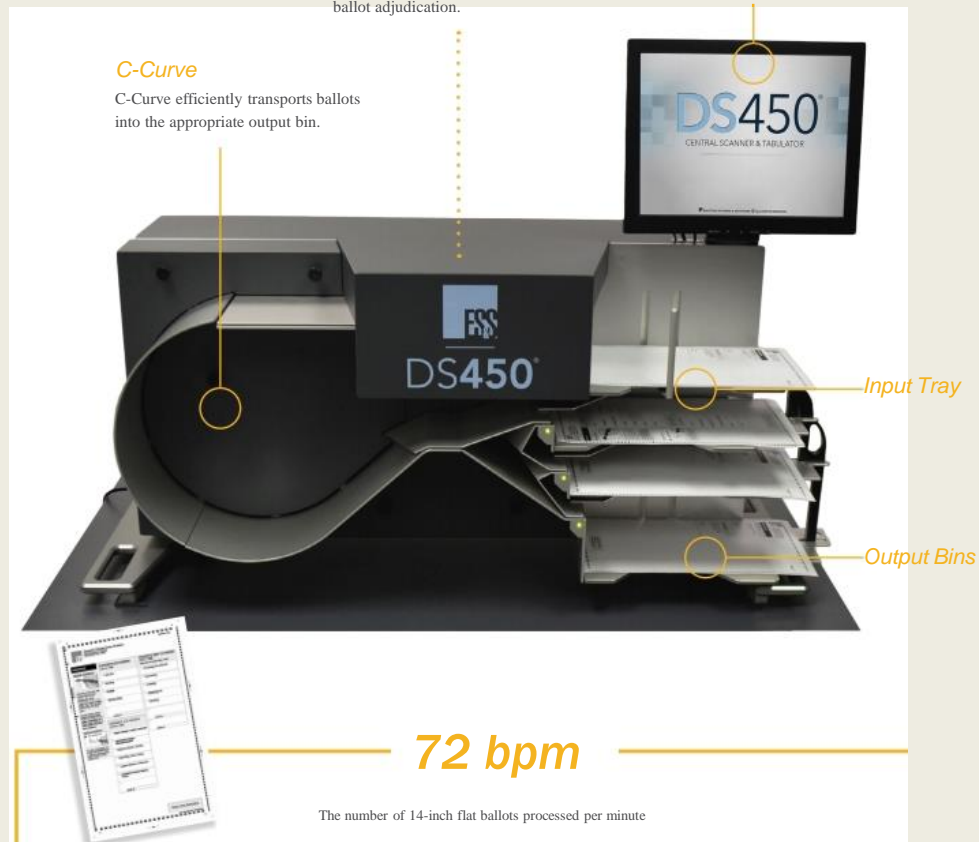
IMR™ and PTRAC™ technology provide unparalleled accuracy that reduces time-consuming manual ballot adjudication.
