## **Countywide Polling Place** (Vote Centers) Update

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#### **Vote Center Voting**

- Vote Centers are a voting option which gives the voter the ability to cast their vote at any polling site on Election Day similar to Early Voting.
- In order to offer Vote Centers as an option to voters in Texas, a County must apply to the Texas Secretary of State. The application process requires the County to conduct a public hearing and also to meet several technical requirements.

### Vote Center Technical Requirements

- Electronic Poll Pad- Implemented in 2018
- Direct Recording Electronic (DRE) or Ballot Marking Devices (BMD)- Implemented in 2019
- Updated Curbside ADA Equipment- Implementation planned for Summer 2020

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#### Vote Center Timeline

- El Paso County will be applying to use Vote Centers for the November 2020 General Election.
- The application process will take approximately 3-4 months (April – July) to complete and involves several steps:
  - Submit Intent to Participate to Texas Secretary of State
  - Overview Presentation to Election Commission and Commissioner's Court
    - Establish and Call for Committee Members (9)
  - Meet with County Stakeholders
  - Public Hearing
    - Methodology for Future Site Selection
    - Plans for Education and Outreach Efforts
    - Community Feedback

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# Vote Center Timeline (Cont.)

- Gather Letters of Support
- Submit Proposal
- Secretary of State informs County of acceptance/denial
- Following Election, County Commissioners must conduct a Public Hearing and the County Judge submits letter requesting "successful" designation to the Secretary of State.

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## Vote Center Site Selection Recommendation for 2020

- Continue to Support Traditional Precinct Voting on Election Day
- Include Limited Number of High Traffic Early Voting Sites on Election Day
- Gather Data and Measure Community Response for Future Site Selection

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#### Vote Center Site Selection for Future Election Years

- Current Texas Election Code allows for a maximum reduction in Precinct Polling Sites to 65% (97 Sites) for first Vote Center election and 50% for subsequent Vote Center elections (73 Sites).
- For a Countywide Election, sites determined by approval of County Commissioner's Court.
- For an Entity Election, sites determined by approval of Entity's Presiding Authority.
- For a Primary Election, sites determined by Political Parties
