

## CARES ACT GUIDANCE OVERVIEW



- THE CARES ACT REQUIRES THAT PAYMENTS FROM THE CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND ONLY BE USED TO COVER EXPENSES THAT—
  - (1) ARE NECESSARY EXPENDITURES INCURRED DUE TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY WITH RESPECT TO THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID—19);
  - (2) WERE NOT ACCOUNTED FOR IN THE BUDGET MOST RECENTLY APPROVED AS OF MARCH 27, 2020 (THE DATE OF ENACTMENT OF THE CARES ACT) FOR THE STATE OR GOVERNMENT; AND
  - (3) WERE INCURRED DURING THE PERIOD THAT BEGINS ON MARCH 1, 2020, AND ENDS ON DECEMBER 30, 2020.

## CARES ACT DISTRIBUTION



- Total for Texas (State, Counties, & Cities) = \$11.2 Billion
- Total for City of El Paso = \$119 Million approximately
- TOTAL FOR COUNTY OF EL PASO = \$27,484,280.40

### MUNICIPAL AGREEMENTS



- Based on State Model
  - Provides 20% funding upfront
  - REMAINING 80% IS REIMBURSABLE GRANT CAN RECONCILE MONTHLY
  - REQUIRES CERTIFICATION OF USE AND DOCUMENTATION IN COMPLIANCE WITH US TREASURY GUIDELINES
  - \$55.00 PER CAPITA
- Deadline to use and submit for reimbursement is December 1, 2020
  - ALLOWS COUNTY TIME TO RECOUP ANY FUNDS THAT WILL BE RETURNED TO US TREASURY
