It has come to the attention of the El Paso County Sheriff's Office that due to crowds anticipated to participate in this year's Fourth of July celebrations, neighborhoods in the unincorporated areas of El Paso County have requested authorization to block off local streets in an attempt to keep their neighborhoods safe.


