
Previous County Action

- The Court adopted an order restricting skyrockets with sticks and missiles with fins (Texas Local Gov't Code§352.051) on **June 6th**, **2022.** (*deadline: June 15th for the sales period of June 24th July 4th midnight*)
- However, the KBDI fell under 575 last week, which means the order is no longer effective.
- County Judge can still issue Declaration of Local Disaster if imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including fire (Gov't Code §418.108).
 - May exceed restrictions authorized by Texas Local Gov't Code§352.051 (e.g., restrict sale and use of all fireworks)
 - Can be issued at any time
 - Declaration lasts seven days unless the Court extends it
 - If the declaration exceeds the restrictions authorized by Texas Local Gov't Code§352.051, the declaration lasts for up to 60 hours <u>unless</u> the Governor grants an extension

Keetch-Byram Drought Index (KBDI)




U.S. Drought Monitor

- Members of the public are invited to celebrate safely at Ascarate Park
- Activities begin at 2:00 p.m. and include food trucks, swimming, and fireworks
- Fireworks Display will take place on the west side of the lake at 9:20 p.m.
- Parking will be \$5 per vehicle and no charge for those who walk in the park



Recommendation

- Keep monitoring the KBDI up until 60 hours prior to 4th of July
- If the County Judge finds that the threat of disaster is imminent, the County Judge may consider issuing a Disaster Declaration that mirrors the June 6th order (ban of rockets with sticks and missiles with fins)
- Keep promoting a safe 4th of July holiday
