So, I want to welcome everyone and anyone from the public. At this time, I will proceed pursuant to Texas Local Government Code, Section 152.905 and ask the Auditor to begin its presentation.

MR. DION: Thank you very much, Judge.

Edward Dion, El Paso County Auditor. I will start with the first item of discussion is the district judges, auditors salary pay scales. They were originally approved August 17th of 2017. The pay scales continue -- they contain classifications of executive management, internal -- internal auditors, professional and general, and it's modeled after the County's 15 year step plan. The pay scale continues to remain consistent with the county salary step plan and therefore the plan is adjusted annually for a cost of living adjustment, if any are awarded to the majority of other county employees.

In this regard, in -- in FY22, the County

awarded an eight percent wage adjustment and therefore the district judges, auditor pay scales were updated accordingly. That is the way the budget was approved in '22 that any raises or wages, increases to other county employes would apply to the auditor's staff and court reporters.

So, otherwise, the salary plan remains the same, with continued support for certification, or pay for nonmanagement staff for certification pay. This plan supports continuing and inclusion of certification pay for nonmanagement employees that achieve professional certifications, and it's only allowed once per employee. And examples are if they become a CPA, a certified internal auditor, certified fraud examiner, or certified information systems auditor.

So, the internal auditors -- also the clarification there is that future vacancies remain. That the future auditors that are filled vacancies will be certified internal auditors. New employees will be placed on district judges county auditors salary step plan based on qualifications and experience as authorized by the auditor and with concurrence of the administrative district judge.

And the pay scales will automatically be adjusted similar to county pay scales only if and when a

cost of living and a wage adjustment are awarded and 1 2 implemented consistent with the County protocols as well as associated appropriation transfers. 3 4 That's everything I had on the auditor pay 5 scale plan. If there's no questions, I will go to Item 6 2. 7 Item 2 --JUDGE ANNABELL PEREZ: Hold on. 8 9 Does anybody have any questions regarding 10 Item Number 1 of the agenda regarding the auditor's 11 salary pay scales as proposed for Fiscal Year 2023? 12 Okay. And I've heard none. 13 Mr. Dion, you may proceed to the next 14 item. 15 MR. DION: Thank you. The next item is certification of staffing 16 requirements pursuant to Local Government Code 84.021, 17 for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1 of '22. 18 19 Staffing requirements total 74, comprising 20 the County Auditor and 73 assistant auditor positions. 21 Three of the positions are -- there's two new 22 accountants with grants compliance audit and one audit 23 generalist in the revenue estimation analysis division. 24 The two grant accountants, the funding is -- one of them 25 is going to be 66 percent from ARPA funds, and 34

percent from general fund. And the second position is fully a hundred percent from the general fund. The one audit generalist is general fund funded also.

The auditor follows County protocol and met with County administration who agreed to support the positions, but the grant positions would remain vacant similar to what we did in Fiscal Year '22, and they were all filled. The process is subject to approval of funding by the Commissioner's Court and we provided data that supported the position increases. We noted that the -- one of the positions was actually recommended by County administration staff. It has already been approved by the Commissioner's Court subject to funding in Fiscal Year '23.

So, the -- this item includes a summary of the auditor's staff oaths of office. Copies were attached. All staff have executed their oath of office and they have been filed with the County Clerk.

With that, does anybody have any questions on this item?

JUDGE ANNABELL PEREZ: Okay. Is there any member of the public that has any questions of the Auditor regarding the County auditors certification of staffing requirements Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2022?

Can I hear --1 2 MS. KELLER: Judge? 3 JUDGE ANNABELL PEREZ: Yes? 4 MS. KELLER: I'm sorry. This is Betsy. 5 Let me see if I can get my camera to work. 6 We don't have any questions. 7 I do want to clarify, Edward. MR. DION: Yes. 8 9 MS. KELLER: This is something that just 10 came up. 11 It may end up -- that one position may end 12 up being a hundred percent ARPA funded, but it's -that's irrelevant to the position. We are evaluating 13 14 because of the budget impacts and revenue projections 15 we're evaluating keeping some things on ARPA longer. 16 MR. DION: Okay. 17 But that to me is -- it's a MS. KELLER: 18 semantics issue. It's not an issue about the position 19 itself, so I did want to clarify that one funding 20 source. 21 MR. DION: Okay. But all three of these 22 positions, I think, we're in agreement with County 23 administration. They will all remain vacant, unfunded 24 until such time as we get together and we have an 25 agreement on the funding like we did in 2022. And the

All positions are being presented at their present FY22 salaries. A total of 74 full-time positions, including three unfunded vacancies as I've explained in Exhibit D, containing a list of the auditor positions, the pay grades and the salaries.

Budgeted salaries include certification

pay for four individuals on -- that are working on their

professional certifications which will be awarded only

after attainment of the appropriate certifications.

Exhibit D also includes a listing of the County's 39

court reporters which also depicts their present

salaries based on the County wage scales at P-16 at

their respective step plan levels.

Furthermore, salaries of the County

Auditor, assistant auditors and court reporters, if and
when the Commissioner's Court approves an increase, such
as cost of living, wage adjustment or step increases for
the majority of other County employees that are non
union, as well as any reductions, it will be requested
that such adjustments also be applied to these
positions.

1 That's all I have on this item if anybody 2 has questions. JUDGE ANNABELL PEREZ: Is there any member 3 4 of the public that has any questions or comment 5 regarding Item Number 3, the discretion regarding the setting of the amount of compensation of the County 6 7 Auditor, assistant auditors and court reporters for Fiscal Year 2023? 9 I've heard none. Mr. Dion, you may proceed. 10 11 MR. DION: Thank you. 12 The last item, Number 4, regarding the 13 Auditor's proposed budget for FY23, beginning October 1, 14 2022, pursuant to the Government Code 81.021. 15 Basically the changes here are the revised 16 FY22 budget versus the proposed '23 budget. Overall, the budget depicts a growth of about \$601,192 or 8.78 17 The increase is attributable mainly to 18 percent. 19 salaries and fringe benefits totaling an increase of 20 582,931 or 8.61 percent, of this amount 211,421 related 21 to the funding of personnel and fringe for the new

The bulk of the increases, other than

positions that are going to be contingent and need to be

funded later in the Fiscal Year for the two grant audit

accountant and one audit generalist.

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those new positions, is mainly the eight percent increase that was awarded in FY22 and the rest is fringe benefits. The one that is the most significant is the health benefits to the County. For all the departments in the County, you're going to see an increase in those budgets and that's outside the control of all the departments, including retirement and the other fringe benefits that are added on.

The declines total about \$9,784 and that was a variety of accounts. Office expense went down by \$1,972. Office expense general -- operating expense general, \$850. Operating expense equipment, \$1,634. Maintenance and repair software went down like \$240. Rentals, leases, software went down by \$5,088.

The increases total about \$28,045 and the bulk of this is \$25,950 for moving expenses. And basically this is a price quote we got from the purchasing agent, for the Auditor's Office, to relocate from the MDR building to the new downtown annex in, I think, the first or second quarter in Fiscal Year '23 once that facility is completed. So, that expense maybe a lot less, but that's the projection we currently received from Purchasing.

The other increases were \$648 for a Public Official Bond typically relating to the auditor that has
