

Certificate of Obligation Request - \$345.7 million



Critical Care Bed Needs





Increase critical care capacity by:

- Relocating endoscopy within the hospital (5 procedure rooms and 16 prep/recovery rooms)
 - \$12.4 million
- That move allows the renovation of the 3rd floor to add 23 intensive care beds
 - \$24.9 million

Consequences of a lack of beds:

- Patients backlog in emergency department
- Scheduled cases cancelled/transfers deferred

Inpatient and Outpatient Surgical Capacity







Need for nine operating rooms/two catheterization labs:

- Remodel to add three operating rooms \$26.76 million
 - Hybrid Operating Room
 - Burn-surgery Operating Room
 - Surgical Robotics Operating Room
- Build an ambulatory surgical center (six operating/two procedure rooms) \$39.95 million
- Two new catheterization labs (which expands specialized procedure capabilities) \$14.26 million

Consequences of a lack of surgical capacity:

- Longer wait times/operating during off peak hours
- Lack of training space for Texas Tech residents
- Impacts ability to recruit/retain residents

Overview:

- 35 clinic exam rooms
- 15 beds in Urgent Care Center
- Total \$32.83 million

Benefits:

- Addresses the needs of a growing elderly population
- Adds an urgent care center south of the I-10



El Paso Children's Inpatient, Surgery and Emergency Department





Increase capacity by:

- Building out 8th floor adds 26 patient beds
 - \$17.5 million
- Adding 9 new emergency department treatment rooms
 - \$11.75 million
- Building a catheterization lab (which expands specialized procedure capabilities)
 - \$7.4 million

Benefits:

- Enhance capacity to treat more patients
- Further reduce outmigration
- Creates additional space for family members and clinical support staff



El Pasoans Deserve Coordinated Cancer Care



Why this is important:

- El Paso is one of the largest metropolitan areas in the U.S. without a cancer center
- Provide a full continuum of supportive services and aftercare in a coordinated center
- Care is fragmented. Coordinated care is critical for treatment:
 - Primary care and prevention
 - Specialist and associated subspecialists
 - Diagnostic and other testing
 - Procedures, treatments & interventions
 - Aftercare and other support
- Total \$78.93 million



Other Necessary Expenses





Equipment, IT, and Property/Land:

- Imaging Medical Equipment \$9.36 million
- Information Technology \$15 million
- Property & Land Acquisitions \$54.47 million
 - Acquisition of Texas Tech properties including:
 - Academic Education Building: 4800 Alberta
 - Health Sciences Center: 4801 Alberta



What is the Cost of this Certificate of Obligation?

For every \$100,000 in property valuation, taxpayers can expect to pay the following:

For the first ten years, 2023 to 2032:

Annual: \$51.80 or \$4.32 monthly

For 2033 to 2047, the rate drops to:

Annual: \$26.00 or \$2.17 monthly

Cost of Money (Inflation)/Higher cost with General Obligation Election in May 2023

October 2022 – July 2023: + \$33 million

Certificate of Obligation Request of \$345.7 million

Total Fall 2022 bond issue debt service estimated at \$537 million

A Positive Economic Impact






Adds approximately 400 high paying jobs at UMC and EPCH
